We also hope to have another W/E in SOUTH WALES before Christmas as only three members of the Unit have ever done and Caving there. I hope to get the key to Agen Allwedd, which is the largest cave in Britain.

### SNAKE PIT HOLE

As mentioned earlier, the M.N.R.C. latest dig is Snake Pit Hole, Opposite Priddy Pools, on the Burrington Road. A discontinued dig can be seen on the left hand side of the road, but the latest attempt is about 15 yds to the right of the road, on Forestry Commission land. The soil is clay like and a bright red colour.

The entrance is quite roomy - about 4ft X 2ft tapering at the ends. At the bottom, it opens into a small chamber about 10X 3 X 2ft high. The main dig veers to the S.W. and is quite roomy, and goes for about 10 ft to a Houlder Choke.

The other dig, started by us, as dug for about 10ins to a flowstone curtain about 2ft square we dug a hole underneath, but was too small to follow. We dug a passage over the top to the obvious way through. On the far side, is a mud slide. Upwards, the slide tends steep to Swallet hole about 6ft from the main entrance. Downwards, the slides goes for 5ft to where the roof aim at reaches the floor. However, the mud is over 8ins deep and leaves hope for the future.
